MINISTERIAL UPDATE

As mentioned at the Church Meeting on 4 February, a meeting took place on 19 February involving as many representatives from the 7 Churches who make up the South East Birmingham and Solihull grouping who could make the date. This had been convened by our WM Synod Moderator to explore the options going forward as regards the provision of a Stipendiary Minister to serve this group of Churches.

Due to existing arrangements enjoyed by some of the Churches the initial scoping will be concentrated on Hall Green United Community Church, Digbeth —in —the —Field and Solihull. These 3 Churches will be responsible for funding ministerial expenses on a pro rata basis, possibly based on membership. The Manse at 118 Buryfield Road will be made available.

A revised and much reduced Pastorate Profile from each of the 3 Churches was urgently requested. This has been prepared by Linda and myself and submitted. Linda has the unenviable task of creating a combined profile for approval by the Ministry Development Committee so that the vacancy can be declared.

We have a new Interim Moderator, Chris Dowd. A Vacancy Call Group will be established to receive profiles of candidates and make all necessary arrangements on behalf of their Fellowship. This Group will consist of two Elders from each Church and we will be represented by lan Carnell and Bey Hands.

A tight timescale is required with the objective being to have someone in place by September.

I will endeavour to keep the Fellowship up to date with developments.
