WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

The next World Day of Prayer is on Friday 3rd March. There will be opportunity to pray at any time of the morning or early afternoon at St Alphege using prayer stations of the type that we laid on when we hosted the event last year.

I have met with Diane, the community worker of the Methodist church, and we have planned what the prayer stations for the day will be. If you would like to help put the prayer stations together, please let me know. It is our intention to get each church in Solihull to present a station each, but that means that we will be responsible for one too.

The world day of prayer material this year is provided by the women of Taiwan on the theme of "I have heard about your faith" from Ephesians ch 1 v15-19. This has influenced the focus of the stations and some of the ideas for presentation and interaction. We won't be using the service they provide but there will be 20 minutes of prayers led from the front in the middle of the day for those who would like some community guided prayers as well as the opportunities to pray alone. Come and speak to me for more information.

Do you know people who have got out of the habit of going to church who used to? This might be perfect for them. They don't have to engage with formal church but it is an opportunity to come into a building again and reawaken their faith and engage with God in a way that is bigger than their internal conversation with God.

St Alphege Church will be open for this for private prayers, using the prayer stations for inspiration and ideas, from 10am - 2.30pm with 20 minutes of prayers from the front at noon.

TOWARDS A THEOLOGY OF CHURCH GROWTH

I have been reading, and have been inspired by the book, "Towards a Theology of Church Growth" edited by David Goodhew. You might be saying to yourself in a slightly sarcastic tone, "that sounds like a pageturner", but it is a very rich book which has encouraged me a great deal. It is a collection of essays by theologians and practitioners from a whole host of theological persuasions, sharing from scripture, church tradition and practice, some insights into a vital part of church life, the need for growth.

I have shared some of the things that I have been enthused by in a few services over the last few months already. After these things have been included I have had comments about how they have given you things to think about too, and how encouraging some of you have found the ideas. Whilst I have built on what I have learnt and applied it to us, there is much that can give us all things to think about from the original articles. With this in mind I am planning to include in this newsletter some of the bits and pieces that I have made note of as being particularly interesting or helpful, so that you can have a think about them yourselves. I will start next month but a few thoughts from the introduction by Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury, to think about in the mean time:

"It has very often been true in the Church that to say one thing is automatically interpreted as meaning that you are denying another. I fear that a book about church growth automatically signals, to some, that the writers are not concerned with the Kingdom of God or with spiritual depth." This is not the case.

"For far too long the very term growth has been resisted in some quarters."

[In this book] "the reader is drawn back to the face of Christ, who alone is the reason for growing churches. Church growth begins with the fact that God reaches out to us in Jesus Christ. Having found us and captured our horizons, Jesus liberates us into a new world in which we are irresistibly drawn to imitate that reaching out."

We currently partner with Solihull Integrated Addiction Service and the Borough Council to provide a premises where those who are homeless or at risk of Homelessness can get help and advice. It is called Solihull Link. I have been asked if they can extend their hours of offering this service to go on an extra hour on each of the two days they are with us, which is a Wednesday and Friday. It is great that they want to be able to extend this service to allow more people to get the help they need.
