## TOWARDS A THEOLOGY OF CHURCH GROWTH

Continuing through the book 'Towards a theology of Church growth' this month we look at chapter 4 titled 'The Ecclesiology of Acts' by C. Kevin Rowe. I will share a few paragraphs that caught my attention and some questions about how we might think about, and use, what we read.

"[Acts] is about how to be a Christian in a world that did not know what being a Christian was. That is the Ecclesiology of Acts: a way of reasoning, and habit of being, that makes Christianity a visible human witness to the Lord Jesus Christ in a world that did not know him."

**QUESTION FOR SOLIHULL URC:** To what extent do you think you live in a world "that [does] not know what being a Christian" is? What ways of reasoning and habit do we have that are distinct from the non-Christians around us?

Acts 19 v23-41 is about a riot in Ephesus and the story tells us about two people. Demetrius, who was a silversmith who made statues of gods, caused a riot complaining about Paul because so many people were becoming Christians and his livelihood was under threat. The other person is the town clerk who quietened the crowd saying that Ephesus [Ephesian culture] was so great nothing could undermine her. C Kevin Rowe says, "Should we follow Demetrius (the Christians are culturally destabilising and are therefore politically problematic) or the Ephesian clerk (the Christians are no worry to us)? To which voice in the narrative should we listen? With few exceptions, modern scholars have sided with the Ephesian clerk: the Christians do not fundamentally threaten larger cultural patterns and can even make rather good citizens.

The problem with this reading is that Demetrius is actually right. ...Jesus and the Ephesian god Artemis are not compatible."

**QUESTION FOR SOLIHULL URC:** To what extent does our message and practice as Christians conflict with the culture we live in? Are we impacting the non-Christian culture around us or are we easily ignored?

Please take the time to share your thoughts about these questions, with the Elders.

#### THANK YOU FROM ST BASILS

You may like to know we have received the following thank you letter from St Basils:

Thank you for your wonderful donation of £584.18 which I can confirm we have received safely, please extend our gratitude to the staff and congregation at Solihull United Reformed Church for their generosity and for choosing us as their Charity of the Year. We are always incredibly humbled to even be nominated for consideration. Without the invaluable gifts we receive from supporters like yourselves we would be unable to provide the support and housing that is lifechanging for so many of the young people we work with.

When St Basils was founded in 1972 we were able to house 18 young men, and provide a street outreach service and advice centre that could help around 30 young people at a time. Donations like yours have meant that we now have over 40 accommodation schemes across the West Midlands, house upwards of 600 young people each night and are able to provide the support and guidance needed for those young people to change their own lives and ensure homelessness is not part of their future.

Although much has changed in the 50 years since we opened our doors, today we continue to live by the philosophy of our founder, "We'll stay with each young person for as long as it takes." – The Late Revd Les Milner

On behalf of the staff and young people at St Basils, thank you for making that possible.

### LOOKING FORWARD

The next two years hold a couple of special anniversaries for us as a church. 2024 is the 10th anniversary of Solihull URC being formed when Olton URC, Hobs Moat URC and Christ Church, Solihull came together. Similarly, we will have opportunity to discuss this at the 'Away Day at home' afternoon on 11th June.

Please have a think about ideas that we might use to mark these events. For 2025 we would like to form a planning group to take up ideas that are offered (and add other ideas, maybe) so if you would like to be a part of this please speak up — newcomers are just as welcome as those who have been here longer. We are going to need all sorts of people with all sorts of different skills and experiences to make a truly memorable, and big, splash in the town.
